In the midst of these difficult times, we write with some brighter news: we are delighted to share with you the inaugural issue of our **North of Byzantium Newsletter**, where you will find updates on upcoming NoB initiatives, events, publications, and resources.

NoB at the International Medieval Congress, Leeds

We were planning a session on the topic "<u>Women and Artistic Production Beyond the Borders</u> of Byzantium" with the following lineup of speakers:

- Lana Sloutsky (Boston University), "Women Without Borders: The Case of Angelina Arianiti"
- Emanuela Cernea (National Museum of Art of Romania), "Post-Byzantine Embroideries from Romania: A Women's Issue"
- Alice Isabella Sullivan (University of Michigan), "Between Byzantium and the Balkans: The Role of Women in the Transfer of Artistic Knowledge in Late Medieval Moldavia"

With the Congress now canceled for 2020, we are planning to resubmit the session at the 2022 IMC Leeds when the theme of "Borders" will be explored anew. We are aiming to submit additional sessions on the topic on this occasion, and so we will circulate another CFP in due time.

NoB at Dumbarton Oaks

We are co-sponsoring an NoB Lecture at Dumbarton Oaks for which we have invited **Ivan Drpić** (Associate Professor, University of Pennsylvania) to talk about his current research on gilding in Serbian painting. The lecture is titled "**The Gold of Banjska**" and it is scheduled for October 15, 2020.
